

This is the ideal course for you next year if you enjoy learning French and want to develop this in a business setting, learning how to use French in the workplace. The need for language skills in the work place is becoming more crucial and this course deals with how languages are applied in the working world. You do not need to have opted for A-level French if you are in KS5 and it is an ideal course to do alongside your IGCSE. In the course you will continue to study a language in a more practical and business focused nature compared to the IGCSE course.

The Accreditation in Languages for Business is a formal qualification which is accredited by awarding body: The Skills and Education Group. The course will be assessed through a combination of module assessments tasks and an exam. Candidates are graded pass, merit or distinction. Assessment tasks will cover all four language skills; listening, speaking, reading and writing. The course will not only build up competency in grammar but will also show that they can use target language in unplanned, spontaneous situations. We will have fun, while gaining a qualification and at the end of the course, you will be able to cope with situations that may arise in the business world. We will also look at some of the major French companies that play an important part in the global market. The Certificate in Languages for Business can be used towards pupils' Duke of Edinburgh Award as it can be used for their "skills" section. It can also count towards the King's High Baccalaureate qualification for King's students.



Pupils write a time plan for each lesson and will collect information for various short exercises for the final course folder, which is then submitted to Leiths. Successful pupils will receive a Leiths Certificate of Attendance This course fulfils the requirements for the 'New Skill' section of the Duke of Edinburgh Bronze Award.

The course consists of at least twelve cooking sessions, for which students must bring their own ingredients, plus 12 planning lessons. There is an extra cost of £125 for this due to the certification of the course. Please check this with your parents.

The teaching of Mandarin in UK schools has become increasingly popular as China plays a greater part in the world's global economy. With 14% of the global population speaking Mandarin, having some linguistic and cultural knowledge of this fascinating country will be a great asset in your future careers as we head into an increasingly globalised business landscape. You may not know that Mandarin is also widely spoken in the Philippines, Singapore, Malaysia and Thailand, amongst other countries!

The lessons will be taught by a qualified Mandarin teacher and will introduce you to the language as well as the culture and history of China. Despite its reputation for being complicated, Mandarin is in fact very accessible partly because the grammar resembles that of English in many ways. You will also learn the history of some of the written characters and understand how the characters represent the word they portray.

Model United Nations offers you the chance to research, debate, and hopefully resolve international issues and crises. Each week you will explore a different issue from the perspective of a particular country. You will research your country's position, negotiate with like-minded countries, propose and debate solutions in order to get a resolution passed. Model United Nations will help you to hone your debating skills as well as develop an awareness of global affairs. The programme is valued particularly highly by international universities but would also provide valuable support for students applying to study history, politics and international relations, particularly those involving an interview. To get the most out of Model United Nations you must be prepared to argue your case. If you are interested in international affairs and enjoy problem solving, negotiation, and debate then consider joining this activity.

In this activity you become a real historian and interview people about their eyewitness memories of historical events as part of a school project. In oral history, we talk to people about their experiences and then turn the stories we collect into an interpretation about the past. The year will be split into phases where we will focus on the key skills of being a historian: Choosing a historical topic, finding participants, understanding the ethics of interviewing people, conducting interviews, interpreting the testimonies we have collected, and finally preserving and presenting the stories we have collected for future generations to enjoy. This could take the form of a written report or we may create a video archive of the interviews that we have collected.

If you are interested in producing a piece of real historical research as well as learning the key skills of a professional historian, then this is the activity for you!

The appeal of Papier Mâché Sculpture lies in the combination of three things- the ease with which it can be made and worked; its immense versatility; and the ready availability of recycled materials. In this activity you can explore the limitless possibilities of Papier Mâché from creating a vast range of objects from pots and bowls to picture frames and carnival masks to three-dimensional forms such as animal sculptures and even stunning fashion accessories.

You will learn the various techniques of Papier Mâché and constructing three dimensional forms from recycled materials, offering inspiring projects through every stage in making the artefact – from choosing the materials and preparing the pulp to applying the

painted, printed or collaged decoration. Papier Mâché ethnic traditions in which the medium continues to play a huge part in the art world today will allow you to experience and to create colourful, exuberant, stylish craft pieces. If you enjoy working hands on with a variety of materials and techniques and enjoy the process designing through to producing your own final artefact then this is the activity for you..

Projects in recent years have involved constructing and testing an air cannon, investigating how to make an effective bike tyre, how to design the perfect tea bag and many more besides. In addition to the wide scope of the project, there is also opportunity to develop new skills such as computer modelling, extended use of datalogging equipment or learning how to use motion capture to record moving systems.

An awareness of Russian may turn out to be an asset in personal statements, whether you choose to study it at university or not, as the skills you acquire have a useful overlap for students of other MFLs, English, Politics & International Relations or History.

Pupils who have an interest in undertaking a degree in Science, Engineering or Architecture may find Science in Action helpful and relevant for their UCAS application and participation in either year of this unique programme has proved to give students the edge when applying to prestigious universities.

Lower Sixth students can undertake some extended science practical work. This is the ideal activity for those students who love to experiment, investigate and ponder. Freed from the confines of the syllabus, we aim high, aspiring to develop synthesis, analysis and applied techniques more commonly used in undergraduate laboratories. Students work alongside each other, developing communication skills as they form efficient working relationships. There is a degree of responsibility – some of the techniques require some careful risk assessment, and the quality of results will depend upon each student's own experimental diligence as well as their ability to work as a team. Across the Lower Sixth programme, we offer options in Biology/Chemistry and Physics/Engineering, and we anticipate that students might choose to follow the particular strands that appeal to them.

Upper Sixth pupils will carry out an independent research project. With limited places, commitment and aptitude must be shown but the potential payoffs are huge: working independently, students can genuinely contribute to furthering scientific knowledge and get a privileged insight into the world of research. Projects are run by a variety of staff who have previous research experience or applications backgrounds. This allows the pupils to be supported to discover and enquire, increasing their self-reliance and developing the skills required for independent research. Projects which develop sufficiently may be eligible for publishing.


